Dear Parent/Carer,

Plans to offer provision to more year groups

I hope you and your families are staying safe and keeping well. This has been an immensely difficult time for the whole country. The Blue Coat children and their families have been in our thoughts throughout this period. We have successfully welcomed back some of the children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 already and the Blue Coat staff have been working hard to keep in touch with all the children through the home learning opportunities (Purple Mash, Blue Coat You Tube channel and work packs) and phone calls home.

You will be aware that the government has stated that it is hoping schools will be able to re-open for all primary year groups by the end of this term but it recognises that this may not be possible. The government has given schools the flexibility to plan provision taking into account their own capacity. At Blue Coat, we are planning to offer an opportunity for all year groups to return on a part-time basis before the summer holidays. We would like to use this as an opportunity to support the children's transition to their new year group, so they will spend this time with their new teacher in preparation for September.

Please be aware that the plans for our provision going forward are constantly under review and will be revised in response to the constantly changing situation locally and nationally.

The key principles for our plans are:

- to ensure that all children, staff and the wider community are as safe as possible;
- to provide an opportunity for as many children as possible to access support and education in school;
- to maintain an environment where everyone in school can feel cared for as well as having access to pastoral support in response to recent traumatic events with someone they know and trust;
- to maintain home-learning support for children if/when they are not in school.

Year Group Provision

Due to robust but necessary safety measures and to take into account the children's needs and well-being at this time, we will be maintaining a careful, phased approach. Unfortunately, we do not have the space or staff to accommodate all the children in the year groups returning at the same time, so there will be a new timetable in place and children will have certain days when their pod (their group-maximum 15) will be in school. The home learning materials will be maintained for the children to use when they are at home.

This is how the provision will look for each year group:

Year 2	From 29 th June, the Year 2 children will be offered part-time provision in the JUNIOR SCHOOL BUILDING in the Year 3 classrooms. Their Year 2 teachers will be there to welcome and support them and they will then be able to work with their new Year 3 teachers. Each Year 2 class will be split into two pods. Half of each class will attend on Monday and Tuesday, the other half on Thursday and Friday. The children will be with their own teachers and teaching assistants. On the days when the children are at home, they will be able to access learning opportunities through the home learning tasks set by their teachers.	Packed lunches will be provided by the school for all Year 2 children. (Your child can bring a packed lunch from home if you wish).
Year 3	For the last week of term (week beginning Monday 13 th July), the Year 3 children will have the opportunity to spend two days in their new Year 4 classroom with their new Year 4 teacher. Each Year 3 class will be split into two pods. Half of each class will attend on Monday and Tuesday, the other half on Thursday and Friday. The children will be with their own teachers and teaching assistants. As now, on the days when the children are at home, they will be able to access learning opportunities through the home learning tasks set by their teachers.	Year 3 children will need to bring a packed lunch or pay for a school packed lunch (£2.30 per day). Children entitled to free school meals will receive a school lunch each day.

On the days when the children are at home, they will be able to access learning opportunities through the home learning tasks set by their teachers.</p>	<p>Year 5 children will need to bring a packed lunch or pay for a school packed lunch (£2.30 per day).</p> <p>Children entitled to free school meals will receive a school lunch each day.</p>
Year 6	<p>Year 6 children who are already attending will continue to be able to attend until Friday 10th July on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday but no longer Wednesday mornings. On Friday 10th July we shall formally say 'goodbye' to the Year 6 children and this will be the last day at Blue Coat Junior School for them.</p> <p><i>There will be key worker childcare provision available for the last week of term for Year 6 children if needed and by arrangement with Mr. Orlik.</i></p>	<p>Year 6 children will need to bring a packed lunch or pay for a school packed lunch (£2.30 per day).</p> <p>Children entitled to free school meals will receive a school lunch each day.</p>

Safety

In line with government guidelines to ensure safety, the following measures will be in place:

- systems are in place to ensure that all areas are rigorously cleaned throughout the day with deep cleans taking place in the middle of the week (the Infant School will be closed on Wednesdays all day and the Junior School on Wednesday afternoon for mid-week deep cleaning);
- to ensure children and adults are always spaced as safely as possible, children will be kept in the same group of 15 or less throughout the school day; these groups will be referred to as 'pods';
- pods will use one classroom throughout the day, playtimes will be at different times so that children in different pods will not come into contact with each other;
- each pod will eat lunch in their own classroom;
- there will be different start and end times as well as different entrance points for each pod to minimise the possibility of too many people gathering in any one place;
- all children will have access to high quality care and support through the teaching team in their pod.

Arriving and Leaving

Children will need to enter and leave through allocated gates (see plan) at specified times. Please see the table at the end of this letter detailing the following for your child: pod name, teacher, days they will be in school, time to arrive, time to leave and gate to use.

It is vital that these timings are followed and that you make sure that your child will be safely collected at the time specified.

Parents/Carers

To maintain safety, parents and carers will not be able to enter the school sites at all. Staff will be at your child's entrance and exit gate to supervise their safe arrival and departure.

Communication with you is very important, however, I hope you understand that we are unable to allow parents/carers access to the offices at the moment. Parents/Carers can give straightforward messages to staff on the gates. Your child's teachers can continue to be contacted through the year group email addresses.

Clothes

Children should wear their own clothes (not school uniform). They will need to wear a clean set of clothes each day. Please make sure that your child's clothes are suitable and practical for a day in school. Shoes need to be suitable for the children to wear outside at playtimes and for all types of activity. The children will **not** need PE kit in school for the time-being.

Lunch

Please see specific lunch arrangements for your child in the table above. *If your circumstances have changed, you can apply for free school meals. Applying online is quick and lunches can start to be received almost immediately; (search for 'Walsall Free School Meals' online).*

Before and After School Club (Blue Coat Plus)

For the time-being, our Before and After School Club (Blue Coat Plus) will remain closed. This is to keep occasions of contact between different staff and children minimised.

Sickness

If your child is unwell, they must not come to school until they are fully recovered.

If your child, or anyone in your household, is displaying any symptoms of COVID-19 (a high temperature, a continuous cough, a loss of smell or taste) then the whole household including your child must self-isolate at home for 14 days in line with government advice. Please keep us informed if anyone in your home develops symptoms of COVID-19 or has a test confirming that they do have COVID-19 as we will have to inform Public Health England straightaway.

General Timetable

Every day that your child is at school will be planned to provide high quality care and education. There will be plenty of flexibility within the daily routine to respond to the children's needs as necessary and appropriate given the exceptional experience we have all faced over the last couple of months.

Each school day will start with an assembly, an opportunity for reflection and pastoral care. During the morning your child will receive reading, English and maths lessons. There will be breaks and opportunities to go outside throughout the day. In the afternoon there will be further pastoral care as well as two learning activities related to other parts of the curriculum.
