We will be marking Anti-Bullying Week with the children from 10th to 14th November. This year's theme is 'Power for Good' - empowering children to speak up against bullying.

Everyone is encouraged to wear odd socks as part of this next Friday—14th November.

We have a zero-tolerance approach to bullying at Blue Coat. We encourage a telling culture and all the children are told to tell an adult at school and/or at home if they or someone else is being hurt and to keep telling until it stops.

Any incident of bullying is dealt with through the use of firm and clear consequences. There is a systematic monitoring process to ensure that any occurrence has completely stopped. The children and staff take their responsibility to keep the whole community safe seriously and incidents of bullying are rare at Blue Coat. The Governing Body is updated termly of any occurrences.

NURSERY AND YEAR 2 FAMILIES PRIMARY SCHOOL PLACE PREFERENCES

If your child will be 4 by 1st September 2026, you must submit your preferences for where you would like them to go to school when they move into Reception. *Children in our Nursery do not automatically move into our Reception. You must apply for a place through the local authority by 15th January 2026.*

If your child is in Year 2, you must submit your preferences for where you would like them to go to school when they move to Year 3. *Children in our Year 2 do not automatically move into our Junior School. You must apply for a place through the local authority by 15th January 2026.*

There will be two meetings to help guide parents/carers through this process.

Morning Nursery parents/carers: Tuesday 25th November 8.45am.

Nursery and Year 2 parents/carers: Tuesday 25th November 2.45pm.
