Is someone bullying you? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

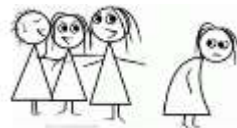

Do NOT keep it a Secret!

Has someone touched you on a part of your body like your bottom, chest or anywhere else you do not like? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Has someone punched, hit or smacked you or hurt you in anyway? You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Do NOT keep it a Secret!

If you are worried talk to someone. There are many staff at school for you to talk to and they will support you.



Main areas of Child Protection concerns are:

- Hitting, smacking, shaking, throwing, burning, biting etc
- Personal or private touching.
- Someone making you watch things that make you feel uncomfortable/ you know are wrong/ that upset you or encouraging you to act in an inappropriate way.
- Things like not providing meals or warmth or clothing. Or perhaps not taking you to the Doctors when you need to go. There may be lots of different reasons why a child is neglected and it is really important that we know so we can help.
- When someone upsets you or makes you feel bad. If someone in your family says horrible things to you and makes you feel sad and worthless.

These are just a few examples for you and if you think you may have a problem that is similar to one of these then talk to Mrs Adlington, Mrs Edgar-Fickling, Mrs Dunbar, Miss Johnston Mr Matthews or Mr Orlik.

How do Blue Coat Infant and Junior Schools work to protect children?

There are lots of different ways, but one of the main ways is making sure the staff here at your school know how to keep you safe and also make sure you have someone to talk to if you need to. Mrs Adlington is here to support young people and their families if there is a Child Protection concern.

Safeguarding and Child Protection mean the same thing and they mean that we look after children and keep them safe.



Sometimes a member of staff at your school will need to check things with the Safeguarding Team and then if they can deal with the issue themselves, they will.

There are times though when they may need to contact some other agencies for support. There are lots of agencies who support children and their families as well.

A grown up from the Safeguarding Team will talk to you and explain all of this and you can always go and ask them questions if you are unsure about anything.
