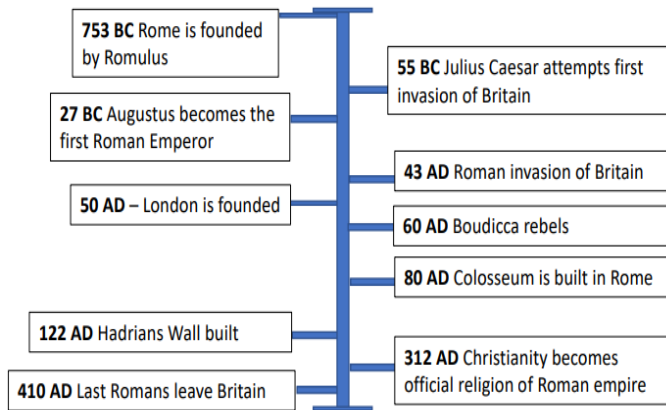




### Key people

Julius Caesar	He was a famous Roman leader. He won many battles for Rome and helped the Roman Empire grow.	
Claudius	The Roman Emperor who launched the military campaign consisting of 40,000 troops and several war elephants which would lead to the conquest of Britain in A.D. 43.	
Boudicca	The Celtic Queen of the Iceni tribe of modern-day East Anglia, Britain, who led a revolt against Rome in 60/61 CE.

Invasion	Forcefully taking over another country.
Latin	The language spoken and written by the Romans.
Celt	People who lived in Europe, and in Britain, who fought the Romans.
Rebellion	People joining together to fight against a certain group.
Rebel	The stand up to or fight against a person or group in charge.
Empire	A group of nations or peoples under one ruler or government.
Emperor	The leader of an Empire.
Conquer	Overcome and take control of (a place or people) by military force.
Tribe	A group of people, families, or villages that share the same language, beliefs, and ancestors.
