Anti-bullying week begins on Monday. There will be a focus on this important subject for the Infant and Junior children in assemblies and lessons throughout the week.



We have a zero tolerance approach to bullying at Blue Coat. We have a telling culture across the two schools and teach the children that if they are worried about anything, they must tell an adult and keep telling until it stops.

All reports are followed up swiftly and firmly. Situations are monitored closely to ensure that any negative behaviour completely stops.

Any allegations or incidents of bullying are recorded and considered by the Governing Body each term.

As a result of our rigorous policy and systems, incidents of bullying are rare and addressed swiftly.

NURSERY AND YEAR 2 PARENTS/CARERS NEED TO APPLY FOR RECEPTION AND YEAR 3 PLACES NOW

This week all Nursery and Year 2 parents/carers have been emailed a letter from Walsall Council explaining the school admissions application process.

Nursery and Year 2 parents/carers must submit preferences for a place in Reception by 15th January.

Even if your child currently attends our Nursery or Year 2, you must still apply for a Blue Coat place if you want them to continue at Blue Coat in the Infant or Junior Schools.

Both Blue Coat Infant and Junior Schools are extremely popular and oversubscribed every year. You must submit an application online by the 15th January, otherwise your child is likely to be allocated a place at a different school.
