
Walsall to Kenya: Us and our neighbour

Word	Meaning
compass	A compass gives directions. The main directions are North, South, East and West
location	The place where something is
locate	To find out where something or somewhere is
vegetation	Plants trees and flowers
globe	A ball shaped object with a map of the world on it to represent the earth
environment	The things that are all around us
characteristic	A distinguishing quality, attribute or trait
satellite	Satellites are objects in space. Some of them take photos of the earth. The photographs are called satellite images
Kenya	A country in East Africa with a population of 50 million people. The capital city is Nairobi.
