Word	Meaning
Texture	The feel, appearance or consistency of a surface or substance.
Collage	Art in which bits and pieces of paper have been painted into a 2-dimensional surface.
Tearing	Breaking a piece of material by force and without a cutting tool.
Composition	The way objects have been arranged in art work.
landscape	Natural scenery.
Horizon line	Where the land or sea meets the sky.
Background	The part of the picture that is behind the main things or people.
layer	An amount of something that covers the surface.

Styles and Techniques

- Collage is a piece of art in which pieces of paper, photographs and other materials are arranged and then stuck down onto a supporting surface. Collage was first used as an artists' technique in the early twentieth century.
- Landscape Art is a drawing or painting of nature. They usually have valleys, trees, rivers and forests in them.

Henry Matisse was an old man and in poor health. He could no longer draw or paint easily, so he began working on his collages, which he is best remembered for.
